In Celebration of Asian Heritage Month

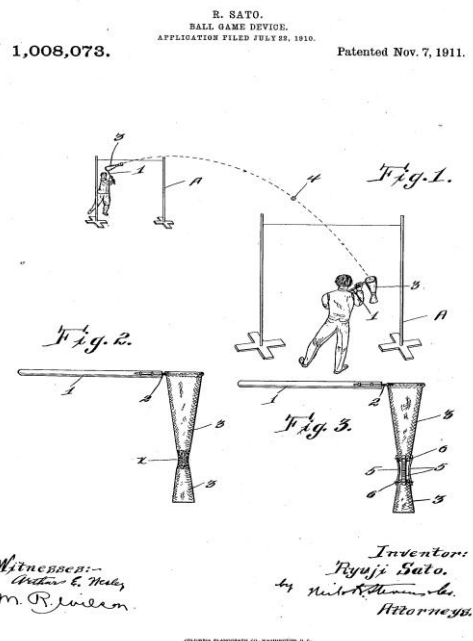

Due to United States immigration laws in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, an Asian could live in Illinois but maintain his or her native land citizenship.

Jokichi Takamine of Peoria, a prolific inventor, is considered to be America's "father of biotechnology". He received several patents from the United States Patent Office on September 11, 1894, including Patent Number 525,823, for "Process of Making Diastatic Enzyme" <http://patft.uspto.gov/netacgi/nph-Parser?patentnumber=525,823>.

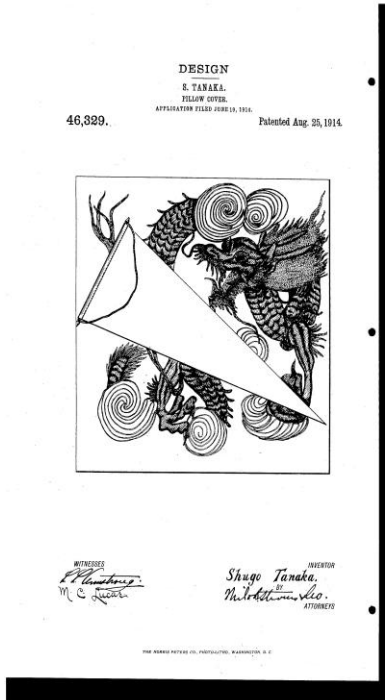

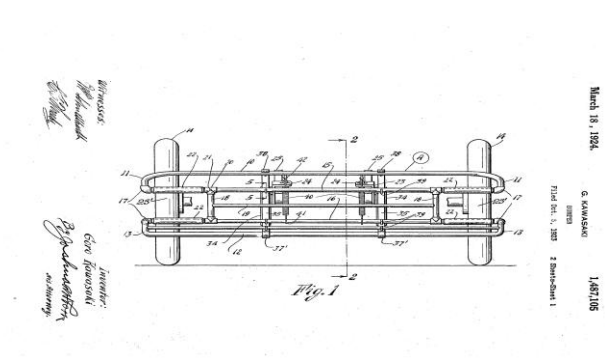
